When you have arrived safely in Oslo, you may pick up your tickets and ask questions in the Nobel event library at Grand Hotel. Many of our international guests will stay at this hotel, including the laureate representatives. This is also the home of the Nobel Peace Prize Banquet. The address is Karl Johans gate 31.

Two of the events are open to the public. Feel free to join the annual torchlight parade in honour of the laureate, organized by the Norwegian Peace Council. If you would like to attend the live Al Jazeera laureate interview, a globally broadcast event, you will need to notify us through this link.

The remainder of the official Nobel Peace Prize events are by invitation only. Your attendance at any or all of these will be specified on your invitation/guest pass.

ACCOMMODATION

TRANSPORTATION

From OSL Gardermoen Airport the fastest route to the city is the Airport Express train (Flytoget). Travel time to the station closest to Grand Hotel, Nationaltheatret, is 24 minutes. Check out the express train

Moving around the city center is fastest on foot, but there are also plenty of bus, tram (trikken) and subway lines (T-bane) in Oslo. **Check out public transportation**

Events December 9 – 11

SATURDAY 9th

13.00–14.00: Laureate press conference at The Norwegian Nobel Institute. Accredited press only.

SUNDAY 10th

11.00–12.00: Save the Children Peace Prize Party at the Nobel Peace Center (by the harbor). Closed event where the laureate representative meets Oslo youth. The event is streamed live: <u>See it here</u>

13.00–14.30: Nobel Peace Prize Ceremony in Oslo City Hall. By invitation only. Please arrive no later than **12.15** due to strict security.

Oslo City Hall will be cleared after the ceremony. If you are attending the interview as well, you will need to pass through check-in again.

17.00–18.00: Al Jazeera laureate interview in Oslo City Hall. Open to the public, but tickets are required. Please arrive no later than **16.30** due to strict security.

If you plan to see the torchlight parade, and have an invitation to the banquet, do note the tight schedule for the rest of the evening.

17.30–18.30: Torchlight parade from Oslo Central Station to the Grand Hotel. Open to the public. At the hotel the laureate representative will greet the crowd from a balcony facing Karl Johans gate.

18.45–22.30: Nobel Peace Prize Banquet at the Grand Hotel. By invitation only. Please arrive no later than **18.30** due to strict security.

MONDAY 11th

10.00–11.30: Nobel Peace Prize Forum in the Oslo University Aula, Karl Johans gate 47. By invitation only.

16.45–17.30: Nobel Peace Prize Exhibition opening at the Nobel Peace Center. By invitation only.

19.00–21.00: Nobel Peace Prize Concert in Telenor Arena at Fornebu. If you have not received an invitation to this event, tickets are available for purchase. The venue is 25 minutes outside the city center. Bus transportation will be organized for our international guests.



SIGHTSEEING

MAIN INSTITUTIONS IN OSLO

Within a few blocks from the Grand Hotel, you will find the National Gallery, the Royal Palace, the National Theatre and not least the <u>Norwegian Parliament</u> (Stortinget). Alfred Nobel entrusted the parliament with electing the members of the Norwegian Nobel Committee.

VIGELAND PARK AND MUSEUM

Gustav Vigeland (1869-1943) designed the Nobel medal. More than 200 of his statues in granite, bronze and wrought iron are exhibited in this popular outdoor park. Check out the park open 24-7

THE MUNCH MUSEUM

Edvard Munch (1863-1944) is the artist behind «The Scream» and one of the most important Norwegian painters. Munch bequeathed his works to the city of Oslo. Check out the enormous collection

THE NORWEGIAN OPERA & BALLET

The iconic building, rising from the sea, was designed by Snøhetta, inaugurated in 2008 with exteriors in white marble and aluminum. You can simply «walk all over it». Check out this «public» opera

ASTRUP FEARNLEY MUSEUM

Has one of the most significant collections of modern art in Northern Europe. Outside is a sculpture park by the sea, located in one of Oslo's newest areas; Tjuvholmen. <u>Check out contemporary art</u>
